






Among the 541 student respondents 50.8% are males while 48.4% are females.


B) What degree program you are pursuing now?




1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?




Out of 541 students 106 (19.6%) said that 70-84% of the syllabus was covered in the class while 411 (76%) students said that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered in the class.

Out of 541 students 196 (36.2%) students confirmed that teachers prepared thoroughly for the class, 308 (56.9%) said teachers prepared satisfactorily while 13 (2.4%) said they were indifferent.


3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?


4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as


5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.

In all 295 students (54.5%) confirmed that the internal evaluation by the teachers was always Fair while 157(29%) said that they were usually Fair.


6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?


7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.


not at all.

9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow




Of the 541 students 254(47%) agreed that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow, 222(41%) strongly agreed, 42(7.8%) were neutral, 16(3%) disagreed while 7(1.3%) strongly disagreed.

10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes




When asked whether the teachers informed about expected competencies, course outcome and programme outcomes 261 respondents (48.2%) said every time, 201 respondents (37.2%) said usually and 43 (7.9%) said occasionally/sometimes.

11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.




Out of the 541 students 271 (50.1%) students said that their mentor every time follows up the assigned task, 175(32.3%) said usually and 57(10.5%)said occasionally.

A majority of 291 (53.8%) students said that their teacher illustrates the concepts through examples and applications while 163 (30.1%) said usually.


13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



Count of 13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



Of the 541 student respondents, 281(51.9%) students said that teachers were able to identify their weakness and help to overcome them every time and 156 (28.8%) said usually


15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.



The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the








Count of 17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.

When asked if the teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities a majority of 256 (47.3%) students strongly agreed and 194 (35.9%) students agreed.


18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.



Count of 18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to



19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.




Of the 541 student respondents 221 (40.9%) students 199 (36.8%) confirmed that 70-89%, 70(12.9%) said 50-69%.






Count of 20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good.

Library and laboratory facilities available in the campus promotes your academic pursuit


